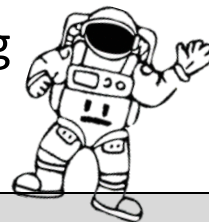
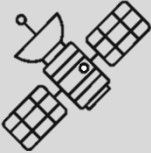
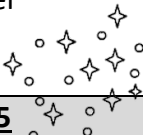




Term 1 - Home Learning

<u>Week 1</u> Due in by Wednesday 11th September 	<u>Tim Peake</u> Tim Peake was the first British astronaut to walk in space in over 20 years. Create a non-chronological report about him and his journey into space. Some of the facts you could include are: When was he born? How old was he when he went into space? Where did he go? What did he do there? How long was he in space for? What other interesting facts can you include? Try to include some pictures in your report.
<u>Week 2</u> Due in by Wednesday 18th September 	<u>Timeline</u> Make a space timeline to show the history of space travel and exploration events. Think about how you will present your work and try to include some pictures. (Begin your moon diary ready for home learning in week 6)
<u>Week 3</u> Due in by Wednesday 25th September	<u>Zodiac Constellations</u> Find out about the zodiac star constellations. You could use diagrams, drawings and pictures to show what you have found out and what the constellations look like. Include some facts about each one. (Continue your moon diary) 
<u>Week 4</u> Due in by Wednesday 2nd October 	<u>Job Advert</u> Create a job advert for an astronaut. Think about the characteristics and qualities that someone would need to have in order to go into space. (Continue your moon diary) 
<u>Week 5</u> Due in by Wednesday 9th October 	<u>Apollo 11 Mission</u> Find out about the Apollo 11 mission to the moon. Choose at least 5 interesting facts and write them in a newspaper report about it. (Continue your moon diary ready for your home learning task next week)
<u>Week 6</u> Due in by Wednesday 16th October 	<u>Moon Diary</u> Using your moon diary, write an explanation about why the moon appears to change shape throughout the month. Include your diary in your home learning book.
<u>Week 7</u> Due in by Wednesday 23rd October	<u>Design and make</u> Design and make a 3D rocket with parachute to aid re-entry into Earth's atmosphere.
