Maths

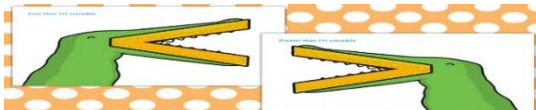
- Practise writing numbers 1-20 correctly. Please help your child to write these numbers correctly. (You could use paints, chalk, pens).

- Practise finding the letters in your name on a computer keyboard.

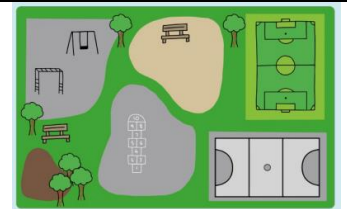
Science- Materials
