

Mathematics

Multiplication and Division 1&2 - This unit provides essential preparation for beginning to multiply and divide 2-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers in the spring term, and for working with fractions. Knowledge of times-table facts is also essential. In this unit children develop their understanding of the multiplicative properties of numbers. This unit follows their learning about multiplication and division and precedes their work on money.

Money – In this unit children will apply their knowledge of addition and subtraction to solve number problems involving money, including bridging a pound. In the subsequent units, contexts involving money feature regularly.

English

The King Who Banned the Dark – This book will inspire children to engage with literature and to think and talk confidently about their response to the book, using prediction, asking questions, making connections with their own experience. Children will write in role to explore and develop empathy for characters. Children will also write for meaning and purpose.

The Wild Robot – This book will engage children with a story that they can empathise with. Children will think about why characters make choices and what impact these choices have. Children will write for purpose and in character.

Spring Term – Year 3

RE

What is the Trinity? Children will look at how the Trinity is represented in different ways through the Christian faith.

Salvation – why do Christians call the day that Jesus died ‘Good Friday’? Children will look at the various events across Holy Week.

DT - Textiles - Cross-stitch and applique

Children will learn and apply two new sewing techniques, cross-stitch, and applique. Children will Utilise these new skills to design and make a cushion to showcase these skills.

History

Cradles of Civilisations – Children will learn about why rivers were so important to early civilisations and how these early civilisations have an impact on today’s world.

The Indus Valley – Linking the knowledge learnt in our geography about the river Indus this unit looks at how people lived around the Indus Valley.

Geography

Mountains – Children will look at various mountain ranges around the world and will look at the lives of those choosing to live in mountain ranges.

Settlements – Children will find out the difference between a village, settlement, hamlet, town, and city.

Science

Light – Children will learn to recognise different sources of light and how we need light to be able to see. Through various investigations children will find out about shadows.

Animals including humans – Children will be able to identify that animals including humans need the correct nutrition to survive. Children will also take part in various investigations.

Art – craft and design – Ancient Egyptian Scrolls

Learning about the way colour, scale and pattern influenced ancient Egyptian art, children explore the technique of papermaking to create a papyrus-style scroll.

Music

Continue to learn how to play the ocarina with increasing fluency and expression. They will be given the opportunities to play and perform well-known repertoire as a whole class or in small ensembles. The children will begin to understand how rhythmic and melodic notation can be represented and follow a small range of staff notation with accuracy at different speeds.
