Set amongst 50-acres of outstanding educational, adventure and sports facilities in the heart of Kent, Grosvenor Hall – a former Police Training Centre – offers young people a unique learning experience and some of the UK's most exciting adventure activities.



Grosvenor Hall

- Over 40 exciting adventure activities, including triple zipwires, 3G swing, double descender and a lake for watersports.
- A 25,000 sq.ft. sports hall and indoor pool complex perfect for all-weather activities.
- Comfortable single sex dorms sleep 2-8 young people.
- A dedicated and fully trained centre welfare team on hand 24/7 to ensure the safety and well-being of your child.
- A safe and secure environment, complete with boundary fencing, electronic gates, night patrols, CCTV and full DBS check on all staff.



Home away from home

- All residential dormitories are warm, comfortable and 100% secure.
- Girls and boys sleep in separate rooms and teacher's rooms are located on the same corridors to allow for plenty of close supervision.
- As part of the transfer from Kingswood to PGL, children will now be asked to bring their own sleeping bag to sleep in.
- Separate showers and toilet facilities are available for girls and boys, some rooms come with en-suite facilities.



Food glorious food!

It's important for students to maintain high energy levels throughout their stay, so 3 freshly-prepared, healthy cafeteria-style meals are served in the communal dining area every day.

A varied choice is always offered, with both hot and cold meals, a salad bar, at least one vegetarian option and yes, sometimes even chips!

Plenty of water is available at all times.

Most dietary requirements can be catered for as long as the centre is notified in advance.



A typical day at Grosvenor Hall runs as follows:

- Breakfast between 7.30am and 8:30am
- First activities kick off around 9.15am
- Lunch between 12pm and 2pm
- A full afternoon of activities
- Evening Meal between 5.30 and 7pm
- The Social Sundown evening entertainment at 7:45pm
- Return to dorms at 9.15pm
- Lights out by 10pm



As a school, we choose our preferred activities before we go then Grosvenor Hall create a programme for us.

- ❖ Two or three sessions in the morning and the same in the afternoon plus the evening activity.
- ❖ Group sizes of no more than 15 plus a fully qualified instructor and a teacher.
- ❖ Students are encouraged and praised during activities but are NEVER forced to take part if they are not comfortable doing so.
- ❖ While other schools may also be present at the centre during our stay, all activities are conducted separately.

Bedtime routine

We return to our dorms at 9:15pm. Plenty of sleep is required to recharge the batteries, so lights are usually turned out by 10:00pm.



Safety & Wellbeing

We know how nerve-wracking it can be letting your child go on a residential visit, so we do everything we can to make it a safe and enjoyable experience for all.

The highest safety standards at all times:

- Continual safety and first aid training for all centre staff
- Regular checks on equipment before and after every activity session
- Qualified First-Aider on site 24/7
- All centre staff are fully DBS checked and are trained to take responsibility for the well-being of the children in their care.



A warm, supportive environment is created for students so they quickly feel at home and the activities are progressive, allowing students to join in at whatever level they're comfortable with.

Cost & Future Communication

You have already received the first letter inviting you to this meeting. This gave the total cost of £387.11.

- We ask for a deposit of £51.11 to be paid by Friday 31st October.
- A further letter will come home next week providing details of a suggested payment schedule.
- Our suggested payment schedule is 8 monthly payments of £42 commencing in November. This means the final payment is made in June. However, payments of any denomination can be made whenever people wish.

We shall again be asking parents to transport to and from Kingswood as this significantly reduces the cost.
