

Dividing by 3

- 1 a) These grapes are shared equally between 3 children.

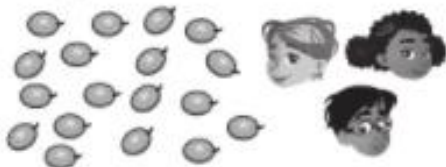
How many grapes does each child get?

There are grapes.

There are children.

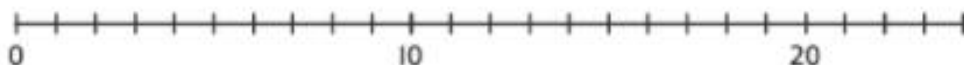
$$\boxed{} \div \boxed{} = \boxed{}$$

- b) Balloons are tied into bundles of 3.

How many bundles can be made?



There are balloons.

There are 3 balloons in each bundle.

- c) 9 badges are shared equally between 3 people.

How many badges does each person get?

Each person gets badges.

- 2 a) Use the array to work out $27 \div 3$.

$$27 \div 3 = \boxed{}$$

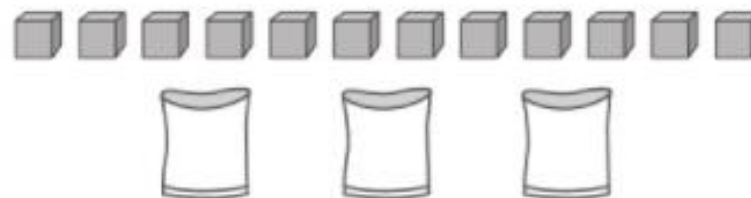


- b) Use the array to work out $15 \div 3$.
