



Procedure for Entrance to Secondary Education (PESE) 2022

A presentation on how PESE works
and advice for interested parents

What is PESE?

- It is the grammar school assessment for Kent
- **Any Y5 pupil in school who is interested in a Kent grammar school place for September 2022 MUST register for testing by 1 July 2021 to take part in the September tests. This includes children with an EHC Plan. Registration opens on 1 June 2021.**
- Parents can register their child online, by visiting www.kent.gov.uk/ola , or they can fill in a paper form and return it direct to the Admissions Team at Sessions House.
NB: Parents who use the drop-down menu to identify their child's current school when registering on line should take particular care that they select the correct school, and not one with a similar name! If they name the wrong school the error may not be spotted before tests are overprinted and despatched. (From PESE Handbook)

How does it work?

- Once you have applied, the children sit the tests on Thursday, September 9th (first full week of term).

- Register for the tests – 1 June - 1 July 2021
- www.kent.gov.uk/ola
- Tests Taken – Thursday 9th September 2021
- Results emailed / posted to parents – Thursday 21st October 2021
- National SCAF deadline – Friday 29th October 2021
