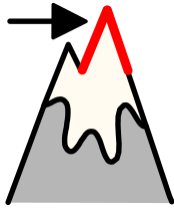


Mountains



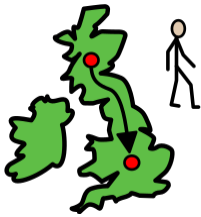
peak

A peak is a mountain or the top of a mountain.



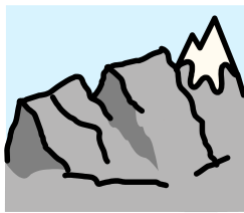
summit

The summit is the highest point on a mountain. Every mountain has a summit, no matter what the height of the mountain itself.



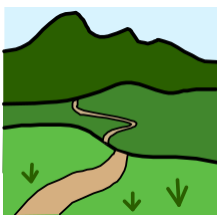
trek

A trek is a long and difficult journey.



ridge

A ridge is a long, narrow, elevated strip of land or any raised strip or band.



landscape

The landscape is everything you can see when you look across an area of land, including hills, rivers, buildings, trees, and plants.

valleys

A valley is a long depression, or ditch, in Earth's surface. It usually lies between ranges of hills or mountains. Most valleys are formed by rivers that erode, or wear down, soil and rocks. This process takes thousands or millions of years.



terraced farming

Method of growing crops on sides of hills or mountains by planting on graduated terraces built into the slope.



terraces

A terrace is an external, raised, open, flat area in a landscape.



mountain range

Mountains are areas of land that are much higher than the land surrounding them. They are higher and usually steeper than a hill and are generally over 600 metres high. They are often found together in a group called a mountain range.
